





- s, -ch, -sh, -x, -o**, add **-es**.
miss – **misses** fix – **fixes**
watch – **watches** do – **does**
wash – **washes**

GADGETS

Gadgets are machines that do something useful. They aren't usually very big. Most gadgets are fun. Some gadgets are smartphones, MP3 players, headphones and DVD players. Many people use these every day.

A. Smartphones

These gadgets are very useful in everyday life. A smartphone is a small phone but it can do much more. A smartphone has many apps to use. It has apps for music, for texting friends, for using the internet, for taking photos, and for watching videos. It also has apps for games. They look like small tablets.



B. MP3 players and headphones

MP3 players are small gadgets. People use them to listen to music. They can listen to the music they like, anytime. They download the music onto the MP3 player and listen to it with headphones.



C. DVD player

People use DVD players to watch movies. A DVD player is connected to a TV. The movies are on a DVD disk. People put the disk in the DVD player, and watch a movie on the TV. Some laptops also have DVD players. People can play CDs on DVD players, too.

They were sad to sell the cow, but there was nothing else that they could do. Jack's mother told Jack. to get as much money as possible for the cow. This was very important. They needed food.








